Nov 18 – A student at Northern Highlands reported that his email account had been used to send derogatory emails. After investigating the incident, it was determined that the school would handle the matter and no police action would be taken.

Nov 18 – A resident reported that he had received several harassing phone calls from the same number. The Detective Bureau is following up on the matter.

Nov 18 – A MacIntyre Lane resident reported that a package which had been delivered to her home was stolen from her doorstep. After a short investigation and calls to the online vendor a replacement was obtained.

Nov 19 – A Harreton Road resident reported two suspicious males approached her to ask if she had found their iPhone, stating that the phone led them to her house. After the resident told them that she did not find a phone, they left the area in a minivan type vehicle. Officers checked the area but could not locate the men.

Nov 20 – Two juveniles were reported to have been climbing a ladder to the roof of a business on West Allendale Ave. After being given a description of the pair, officers located them a short distance away from the store. They were then brought to the high school, where they were supposed to have been. School officials handled the matter from that point.

Nov 21 – The pastor of an area church was contacted by a man who asked for financial assistance from the church. Sensing something was amiss, the pastor checked further on him and found that he had been involved in an attempt to defraud another church in the past. When the man arrived at the church with a female companion, the pastor called police, who located the pair's car driving away from the church. After speaking with officers, the two elected not to speak with the pastor and left the area.

Nov 21 – A DPW employee reported damage to signs and a telephone pole mounted signal box at the intersection of Franklin Turnpike and Chestnut Street. It appeared that a truck jumped the curb, ran over the signs and struck the pole and box. O&R was contacted to disconnect power to the signal box and check the pole.

Nov 22 – Another hit & run was reported by a resident of West Allendale Ave. He observed a vehicle strike a tree and leave the area headed toward Crescent Ave. Officers located the vehicle by following the trail of oil and coolant on the roadway, which led to a residence in Allendale. When contacted by officers the driver of the vehicle stated he failed to take his medication, which caused him to become lightheaded and strike the tree. The driver was issued summonses for leaving the Scene of a MV crash and Failing to report involvement in a MV crash.

Nov 22 – An Orchard Park resident reported that her vehicle had been struck by another vehicle which then left the area. Officer checked, but could not locate the offending vehicle.
