



## Allendale Police Department News Release 5/15/2015

April 21 – Officers were called to Powell Road for solicitors knocking on doors after the permissible hour of 5:00 PM. Upon contacting the 20 year-old man from Tampa, FL at 8:30, officers determined that he worked for a company which had registered to solicit, but was not abiding by the ordinance. He was issued a Borough Ordinance complaint for the violation and transported to Dunkin Donuts to await a ride. The following day, two other solicitors working for the same company, were issued summonses for the same violation. One was a 28 year-old man from Tampa, FL working on Harreton Rd and the other was a 22 year-old from Weeki Wachee, FL who was on Arcadia Rd.

April 26 – Officers observed a vehicle parked on Green Way near the entrance to the Celery Farm. Upon entering the park they found three adults and one juvenile at an observation deck. The four were advised that they were in violation of the Borough Ordinance specifying park hours (6:00 AM to ½ hour after sunset) and escorted to their car.

April 27 – While conducting a traffic enforcement detail on Franklin Turnpike, Officer Hillgardner stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. After speaking to the driver she found that there was a warrant for his arrest from Holmdel. The 24 year-old man from Jackson, NJ was arrested and brought to headquarters where he posted bail and was released.

April 27 – A Powell Road resident reported that his home was burglarized. Officers responded and found damage to the rear of the house, indicating a possible entry. Nothing was reported missing at the time. The Bergen County Sheriff's ID bureau was called to process the scene and the Detective Bureau is investigating.

April 27 – A West Crescent Ave. resident reported that approximately \$500 has been stolen from his wallet over the past few weeks. At the time of the report nothing else was noticed to be missing from his home. The Detective Bureau is investigating.

April 28 – A local store owner turned in a fraudulent Maryland driver license which was used in an attempt to purchase alcohol. After an investigation, a local juvenile was determined to have used the license for the attempted purchase. A complaint

was issued for Misrepresentation of Age to purchase Alcohol and mailed to the juvenile.

April 30 – Officer Rizzo was conducting a traffic enforcement detail on Forest Road and stopped a vehicle for speeding. After speaking to the driver he found that there was a warrant for his arrest from Ho-Ho-Kus. The 20 year-old man from Sloatsburg, NY was arrested and brought to headquarters where he posted bail and was released.

May 2 – Officer Rosendahl was dispatched to check on a suspicious male who was reported to be sleeping near the NJ Transit station. After speaking to the man he found that there was a warrant for his arrest from Laurel, NJ. The 52 year-old man from Upper Saddle River was arrested and brought to headquarters where he posted bail and was released.

May 9 – Officer Hillgardner was dispatched to investigate a single vehicle motor vehicle crash on Powell Road. When she arrived she observed that the driver of the vehicle, a 28 year-old man from Saddle Brook, appeared to be intoxicated. He was arrested and brought to police HQ where he refused the breath tests. He was released to a friend after being issued MV several summonses.

May 9 – Sgt. Griffith and Officer Bartoloma were requested to check the high school for two people on the roof. The officers located two area juveniles, who were then brought to police HQ. Their parents were contacted and took custody of them.

May 12 – A resident came to police HQ to report that someone had fraudulently used her credit cards within the prior week. The cards were immediately cancelled. The Detective Bureau is investigating.

May 12 – A resident reported to police that someone filed a tax return in his name. At report time he was still obtaining the details of the incident, but the Detective Bureau was notified and is investigating.
